The Certificate II in Music Industry (Foundation) is based on units of competency selected from the CUS01 National Music Training Package. The qualification is aimed at students with a strong interest in industry focussed training within the music industry. This is a competency based qualification with an expected duration of 2 years.

COURSE STRUCTURE:

To attain a Certificate II in Music Industry (Foundation), 10 units must be achieved.

- CUSMCP01A Contribute creative music ideas to a project
- CUSMPF02A Develop technical skills for playing or singing music
- CUSSOU06A Lay sound tracks
- CUSSOU01A Move and set up instruments and equipment
