The Instrumental Music Academy at Chancellor State College, offers students have the opportunity to learn a

- ♪ Woodwind (flute, oboe, clarinet, bass clarinet, bassoon, alto/tenor/baritone saxophone)
- ♪ Brass (trumpet, trombone, euphonium, french horn, tuba)
- ♪ Orchestral Percussion (tuned and untuned)
- ♪ Orchestral Strings (violin, viola, cello, and double bass)

Instrumental Music is offered on all instruments from Year 3. **Secondary Campus enrolment requires prior tuition.** Specialist instrument placements are occasionally offered on the Secondary Campus, based on specific ensemble needs and timetabling.

Please note: Beginner students for the music program cannot be offered a place in the program if they arrive at the school during the year. They will be placed on a waiting list and assessed for the start of the following year. Students who have been in a music program at their previous school and have their own instrument, will be accepted and placed into a group of a similar level on arrival at Chancellor.

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Expectations of Instrumental Music Academy Members

- Pay program fees;
- Participate in:
 - Designated College ensembles
 - All lessons
 - All rehearsals (most scheduled before and after school hours)
- Come to all performances prepared with correct uniform and equipment;
- Represent yourself and the College in an exemplary manner at all times;
- Maintain a high standard of effort and behaviour in all subjects (including meeting all due dates for assessment pieces); and
- Work hard in and away from lessons and rehearsals to improve yourself and your playing.

Should a student fail to meet the above-mentioned commitments, they will be challenged to make the required improvements, or face withdrawal from the Instrumental Music Academy at the discretion of the Principal, without refund.

Short Performance Video

Instrumental Music students entering Chancellor College **Secondary Campus** are asked to prepare a short performance video to be returned with this application. (No face-to-face auditions required). This performance video will be used to help staff place each student in the most suitable performance ensembles and lesson groups for best possible individual learning outcomes. The video can be separate items or one video for all items and can be filmed in the order of the applicant's preference.

1. One prepared solo piece. Please do not play a school band or orchestra piece. You may choose to use a backing track if you wish, however this is optional. (This can be from your tutor book).
2. One scale and arpeggio which demonstrates your current technical ability and range
3. (Optional) An introduction of yourself. You might consider talking about: why you enjoy playing your instrument? what you find challenging about music? what you find easiest? What are your goals? What are you looking forward to most about high school?

Please note, some instruments are available for hire through the College – please enquire with the Instrumental Music Staff regarding availability.
