

Persuasive language is used every day in many situations, from Politicians convincing us to vote for them to you trying to convince Mum and Dad that you really need that new mobile phone. This term, we will convince others to have more live events outside of the capital cities, such as the Sunshine Coast. We will use persuasive devices and subjective and objective language to get our point across.

This term, we will continue to build our knowledge of number, including whole and decimal numbers through our Daily Maths. We will also learn how to transform 2D shapes across quadrants of a Cartesian plane. We will solve problems with timetables to make sure we get to places on time. We will explore the differences between prisms and pyramids and analyse the features of each.

Science

We will learn that energy can be generated from a range of sources and can be transferred and transformed through circuits. As we become more aware of the sustainability of energy sources we will learn that communities learning from the past We will investigate the historical developments in electricity.

Technology

We will understand what are sources of light, why humans need light, why humans want to control light, understand the occupations which design light controlling systems and understand what is a 'Design Challenge'. We will then describe how these ideas connect to the Arduino and the data process. We will transmit data from logging into the computer to the Arduino showing light.

What an opportunity our early Australians had - to create a nation! What would it look like? Who was in and who was out? How would it work? So many decisions!We will explain the importance of people, institutions and processes to our democratic system and the rights and responsibilities of Australian Citizens by examining sources to identify different perspectives in the past and present.
