Year 10 Transition

Transitioning into the senior school as a year 10 student comes with changes to the school day and uniform.

School Day

- All year 10 students have a flexible finish on Wednesday. Classes conclude at 12:50pm.
- If students are required to attend during the flexible period
 4 will be given notice.
- Math and English Tutorials are available on Wednesday Period 4 in SS block for students remaining on campus.



Curriculum Offerings

Year 10 students undertake their curriculum selections for a whole year to enable them the best opportunity to prepare for their Year 11 and 12 studies.

Students select 4 compulsory core subjects (one from each area) and 2 elective.

- Most year 11 subject prerequisites are based on achievement in the core subjects.
- All students should aim for a C in English, Humanities, Mathematics and Science to access most subject options.

2025 Transition Activities

- Career Exploration Weeks 1-5 during Tutorial lessons
 - Students will complete career journey activities in Tutorial
- Subject Information Talks Weeks 2-4
 - Students will have a rotation of subject talks from Heads of Department
- Subject Selection OneSchool selections open Week 4 (4 Aug)
 - Students need to have subject selections completed online prior to STEP Plan
- Senior Transition Education Plan Meetings Week 6 (18-22 Aug)
 - Students will have a 15 minute meeting with one of the STEP team to discuss their interests.
 - Information and selections communicated with parents week 7 (25 Aug)

Growth Career Areas on the Sunshine Coast (2027–2030)

- Health Care & Social Assistance: nurses, carers, allied health
- Education & Training: teachers, aides, tutors
- Construction: trades, project managers

- Retail & Hospitality: managers, chefs, baristas
- Public Safety & Administration: police, clerks, inspectors

Other Study Options – Year 10

Students may select one other external study option to support their pathway planning.

School Based Apprenticeships / Traineeships	External Vocational study	Work experience	HeadStart UniSC and other similar programs
Students can engage in a school base apprenticeship or traineeship from year 10. Generally students locate their own opportunity with support from our ILO.	This includes TAFE and a range of other offerings via partnered RTOs	Year 10 students can undertake up to 30 days of work experience per year. Some students may choose to complete week blocks or a day a week over 3 terms.	HeadStart is available from Semester 2. Students complete an interview with a Guidance Officer to discuss options and suitability.

Pathways Year 11 and 12

At Chancellor State College, students generally select one of two pathways:

- ATAR Pathway A pathway to university. Students generally complete
 5 General subjects
- A Future Skills Pathway pathway to a number of further education and employment options. Generally a mix of General, Applied and Vocational options.

Students wishing to keep university as an option but don't follow an ATAR Pathway can:

- Include a Certificate III course in program gives a rank score for university entry.
- Complete a Tertiary Preparation Program or equivalent at a university
 generally are free to complete and give a GPA for entry.
