



Year 10 - A Transition Year

- Year 10 is the entry point to the senior phase of learning. It is the final year of the Australian Curriculum, and forms the foundation of knowledge, understanding and skills required for senior studies.
- It is when students reflect on and make important decisions about:
 - achieving a <u>Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)</u> or <u>Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA)</u>
 - undertaking <u>Vocational Education and Training (VET)</u>
 - seeking school-based training and apprenticeship opportunities for commencing tertiary studies.
- In Term 2, we will invite all Year 10 parents and carers to our Year 10 Parent and Community QCE information evening.

Year 10 - A Transition Year

- Year 10 brings many exciting opportunities for students to explore and learn about themselves and their pathways.
- Students will complete their senior pathway plan.
- Students transition from the compulsory phase of learning to the post compulsory phase of learning.
- Students can begin accessing vocational education options.
- Students can engage in work experience Term 4, Week 8 and up to an additional 25 days where needed.
- Students gain the flexibility to decide how to manage their study with a flexible Period 4 on a Wednesday.

Compulsory Phase of Learning

Compulsory Participation Phase of Schooling - Education Legislation Amendment Act 2006

A young person must:

- Stay in education or training for 2 more years or
- Get a QCE or
- Get a Certificate III vocational qualification or higher or
- Turn 17, which ever comes first
 - There is an exception for young people working 25 hours or more per week

Our goal for all Senior students:

- 1. All students obtain a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)
- 2. Students either obtain:
 - An ATAR that will allow for options heading into further study, and/or;
 - A VET qualification of Cert III or above
 - A pathway to work

QCE for all Senior Students

Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)

For students completing Year 12 from 2020



- The QCE is Queensland's senior secondary schooling qualification.
- Students can choose from a wide range of learning options to suit their interests and career goals.
- To receive a QCE, students must achieve the set amount of learning, at the set standard, in a set pattern, while meeting literacy and numeracy requirements.



Year 10 Subject Options

- All Students in Year 10 study:
 - English
 - Humanities
 - Mathematics
 - Science
- All students complete a minimum of 2 other subjects:
 - Internal electives
 - External certificates
 - School based Apprenticeships & Traineeships
- All Electives are generally studied for a whole year but not less than a semester.
- In Year 10, some subjects studied will contribute to a students QCE.

Year 10 Alternate Options

- External certificates
- SBA / SBT
- HeadStart UniSC- from Semester 2, Year 10

Career Planning and Tutorial Program

- Students will access motivational, wellbeing and external pathway providers during tutorials across the year.
- Students will complete career investigation activities in preparation for SET planning in Terms 1 & 2.
- Students will complete a Cert I in Basic Financial Literacy in Terms 1 to Term 4. The Cert I will be delivered online via QLearn in Tutorials and contributes 2 QCE Credits towards a student's QCE.

Tutorial Program

QCAA 'MyQCE' – register and access their Student Portal Monitor progress and access information for their QCE.

QCAA - Academic Integrity Course, required at the start of their Senior Education phase of learning.

Cert I Basic Financial Literacy


This qualification covers:

Personal Budgeting, Personal Savings, Consumer Debt and Consumer Credit, Superannuation, Australian Financial System and Markets, Taxation

Students need a **Unique Student Identifier (USI)** to be awarded VET Certificates

SET Planning


- SET planning is a process designed to guide your child on a successful pathway throughout senior secondary and beyond Year 12 into postschool education and work.
- The aim of SET planning is to provide your child with the skills and knowledge needed to develop a genuine career pathway, and a life of personal choice.



SET Planning

- Year 10 SET plans will occur in Week 4 of Term 3.
- Each child is required to have a one-on-one meeting with a SET Planner and a Parent or Carer to discuss their pathway and subject selections.
- Meetings are scheduled from **Tuesday 5th to Friday 8th August**, with appointment times from **7:30am to 6:00pm**.
- Appointments will be available for booking Week 2, Term 3.
